## II. Procedures for Baggage Transport on Passenger Trains

- 26. The passenger may carry free of charge baggage that is easy to carry and the dimensions (length, width and height) of which **do not exceed** 60 x 40 x 20 cm, and weight does not exceed 20 kg. For transport of baggage with the dimensions (length, width and height) **exceeding** 60 x 40 x 20 cm, and weight exceeding 20 kg, a fee is charged. The fee for baggage transport is charged by a baggage ticket.
- 27. Baggage may not be placed in a place intended for passengers or where it causes inconvenience to other passengers.
- 28. Crutches, strollers, wheelchairs for disabled persons and baggage with **one** of its dimensions (length, width or height) exceeding 60 x 40 x 20 cm (such as a collapsible fishing rod, skis, sledges) may be carried free of charge if the technical capabilities of the train allow it.
- 29. A passenger who is entitled to reduced fares in the territory of Latvia shall pay for the carriage of baggage in excess of the free baggage allowance at the rates approved by the carrier.
- 30. The passenger shall ensure that the baggage is carried in appropriate packaging for transport and storage.
- 31. It is prohibited to carry items on the train that may harm other passengers, their baggage or the train. It is prohibited to carry dangerous items (including substances), explosives or highly flammable items (including substances), as well as oxidising, toxic, radioactive or corrosive, unpleasantly smelling substances or items that may cause infections, as well as items (including substances) that may cause inconvenience to other passengers.

Bicycles are carried on a train with special bicycle holders in accordance with the number of bicycle holders for a charge. If the train is not equipped with bicycle holders, the maximum number of bicycles carried in a train wagon shall not exceed 5 (five) bicycles.
